In the aftermath of World
War Two, approximately
three million Sudeten-
Germans were expelled
from their homes in the
former Czechoslovakia

because of their part in the dismemberment of the Czechoslovak Republic by Nazi Germany in 1938-39. For many years their representatives, the Sudeten-German Association, attempted in vain to redress the wrong done to their people. However, the end of the Cold War has given a new impetus to their campaign. Currently they attempt to block Czech entry into the EU unless there is restitution of confiscated properties. Jürgen Tampke tells the

 At first glance, the

archaeological record of Moravia has been quite visible in the Anglophone world. Bits and pieces of this record have repeatedly made headlines in both the general and the specialized press for close to a century. First, it was the discovery of a mass grave of some 21 individuals found at the Upper Paleolithic site of Pfdmosti, then the oldest evidence for ceramic technology reported in the first quarter of this century in the Illustrated London News. Later on,

the site of Petfkovice, dating some 23,000 B. P. , produced evidence for the oldest burning of coal for fuel, while more recently the New York Times informed us that imprints in clay at Pavlov I attest to the oldest evidence for the making and use of textiles. This list of cultural innovations documented from Moravia can be expanded to include the use of ground stone technology to make stone pendants (e. g. , at Pfdmosti), of large ground-stone rings whose use remains enigmatic (e.

g. , at Bmo II, Predmosti, and Pavlov I)-but which if found in more recent contexts would pass as querns-as well as of possible needles (again at Predmosti).

Perhaps no country benefitted more from the Marshall Plan for assistance in reconstruction of Europe after World War II than Austria. On a per capita basis, each American taxpayer invested \$80 per person in the Plan; each

Austrian received \$133 from the European recovery program, more than any other of the sixteen participating countries. Without the Marshall Plan, the Austrian economic miracle of the 1950s would have been unthinkable. Despite this, contemporary Austria seems to have forgotten this essential American contribution to its postwar reconstruction. This volume in the Contemporary Austrian Studies series examines how the plan affected Austria, and how it is

perceived today. The political context of the Marshall Plan in Austria is addressed in essays by Jill Lewis and Matthew Berg. Dieter Stiefer describes the vast Soviet economic exploitation of their Austrian occupation zone. Andrea Komlosy shows how the Marshall Plan helped complete the division of Europe. Siegfried Beer suggests the secret involvement of the CIA in the Marshall Plan, while Hans Jürgen Schröder analyzes the effectiveness of Marshall Plan propaganda

programs in Germany and Austria. The macroeconomic impact of Marshall Plan funds on Austrian economic policy is outlined by Hans Seidel. Kurt Tweraser, Georg Rigele and G3nter Bischof suggest the microeconomic importance of funds for the steel, electricity and tourist sectors of the Austrian economy. Wilhelm Kohler's sweeping analysis compares the American transfer of funds to postwar Europe with current debates about the

cost of European Union enlargement. The legacy of the Marshall Plan is addressed by former Austrian Finance Minister Ferdinand Lacina. Kurt Löffler and Hans Fubenegger summarize the activities of the Economic Recovery Program Fund. Coming on the heels of the fiftieth anniversary of the Marshall Plan, this compelling overview of the Plan and its impact will be important for historians, those interested in international politics, and Austrian

scholars. G3nter Bischof is professor of history and associate director of Center-Austria at the University of New Orleans; Anton Pelinka is professor of political science at the University of Innsbruck and director of the Institute of Conflict Research in Vienna; Dieter Stiefel is professor of social and economic history at the University of Vienna and executive secretary of the Schumpeter Society in Vienna. This volume offers a collection of articles, mostly by contemporary

Austrian-born historians, touching on various phases of the Marshall Plan administered through the European Recovery Program (ERP) and its successors counterfunds' assistance to the present. A splendid introduction followed by the key thirteen articles on the plan is augmented by several nontopical essays and book reviews, along with a survey of Austrian politics in 1998. A number of articles emanated from a 1998 conference at the University of New Orleans. Both novice and specialist

will appreciate this book."-

(allemand) réunit deux cent quarante-deux études de civilisation autrichienne, témoignant des réalités de l'Autriche moderne post-habsbourgeoise entre 1918 et 1938, gérant longtemps le lourd héritage du traité de Saint-Germain-en-Laye (1919). Le volume illustre les nombreux visages de la Première République (1918-1934) - véritable champ d'expérimentation de l'apprentissage démocratique - liée, entre autres, aux noms illustres de K. Renner et d'I. Seipel

; il brosse le portrait plus sévère de l'État corporatiste (Ständestaat, 1934-1938), expression d'une dérive spécifique, alliant idéologie autoritaire et christianisme, et culminant dans l'austrofascisme, initié par E. Dollfuss et K. Schuschnigg. Cependant faiblesses et/ou errances des deux systèmes sont constamment à inscrire dans le débat de politique intérieure et extérieure autour de l'Anschluss, interdit au sortir de la Grande Guerre par les

vainqueurs. En Autriche, multiplicité des langages et expression des mentalités de l'entre-deux-guerres, également à travers les premières manifestations de la Résistance et de l'exil, apportent des éclairages fascinants et révélateurs sur cette époque, soulignant la complexité de l'échiquier, en surface et en profondeur. En définitive, ces deux périodes politiques et l'éradication de l'Autriche souveraine (1938-1945), annexée par le IIIe Reich, furent riches en

enseignements pour la Seconde République qui veilla avec vigilance à la solidité de ses assises démocratiques.
