Information on the educational system of West Germany and guidelines on the placement of German students in U.S. high schools and colleges are presented. After a brief introduction on the country and the basic structure and principles of the educational system, attention is

directed to preschool, primary, and secondary education. Included are reproductions of certificates of completion and grade reports from different schools, along with information on grading systems. Also considered is vocational education in Germany, which combines part-time vocational school with on-the-job training. Eight types of vocational schools and their programs are described, along with vocational training in nursing, physical therapy, medical technology, and

paraprofessional health fields. Additional topics include: demographics and higher education, higher education legislation, access to college, types of institutions and selected programs of study, and adult and continuing education.

Reproductions of diplomas and related documentation illustrate the text.

Guidelines are provided to help admissions officers determine the admissibility and appropriate level of placement of German students in U.S. institutions. Appended are a glossary, a list of German colleges and universities, and a list of occupations requiring vocational training. (SW)

This report provides an overview of policy strategies on early childhood education settings (from birth to primary schooling) in eight countries. Data were collected using a policy questionnaire addressed to and completed by the National Research Coordinator(s) (NRC) of Chile, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Italy, Poland, the Russian Federation and the United States. The countries that participated provide interesting illustrations of early childhood education policy in action in a

range of diverse contexts. Analysis of the systemic and structural results of ECE policy at national and, where necessary, subnational levels, enables transnational comparisons in policy and systems. Key policy changes, both underway and planned, are documented. These data reveal key findings in each of the five policy areas as covered in the questionnaire and this report: public policy; delivery models and providers; participation and enrollment; quality assurance systems; and expectations for child outcomes. In particular, the study aims to provide meaningful information for countries, states and jurisdictions across the world in relation to early childhood education, mapping the systems, structures and user pathways in place, along with the perceptions of

stakeholders about the system, its functioning and impact. This comprehensive assessment of the wider policy contexts and settings for early childhood education includes teacher/practitioner qualifications, pedagogy approaches, and opportunities for professional development. Such information will enable countries to review their early childhood education systems in an international context.
