dodged straight drives from Sachin Tendulkar, calmed down Shane Warne and signalled leg-byes in his own uniquely elegant and justly famous style. His experience of umpiring spans three decades; the list of players he has umpired, known and counts as friends reads like a cricketing WHO'S WHO. And he is held in rare esteem and affection by virtually everyone involved in cricket. Beginn

ing with an evocative account of Shepherd's North Devon childhood, the book then covers his entire career from playing for Devon to becoming an umpire. Containing a wealth of informed opinions on all aspects of cricket, past, present and future, it is also full of anecdotes from a man who has stayed at the centre of the game for nearly forty years, never losing his love of the game or

his sense of humour. The Sedberghian Xlibris Corporation Match-fixing in Cricket has existed as long as the game itself. A triad of shepherds had to step in and protect the honour and name of the game. However with that backdrop, romance is one of the themes in this novel that is set between India and England. Crick et Maiden opens in Bangalore, India during the colonial

era of England ruling India. It is a story of one great Sport and Romance. A young English cricketer is caught up in a match-fixing chaos, which with the help of the 'guardians' of cricket, the Shepherd's Triad, he successfully squashes the plot to lose a match against the amateur's team. He tragically loses his fiancée at the hands of the aggrieved team mates and the bookmaker. Fast forward 200

years later, a similar scene in England and the game is threatened by the same scandal of match-fixing. Murder, attempted murders, romance and a search that takes the heroes and heroine from Europe to India under the mysterious watch of the 'cricket maiden' and the Shepherd's Triad. The police, together with one of the richest families in England, work

tirelessly to solve the murder of the Cricket coach. The search for clues and answers send them across continents. A female fashion journalist who happened to be at the match, standing in for a colleague, where the murder took place, accidentally becomes a target for the killer. Landon, an aggrieved ex-policeman, is called in to assist with the case and becomes enamoured to the female journo. He

steps in to coach the amateurs as well as put a new team together after the death of the coach. The amateur team's best player is set off against the Professional team's best player, with a Bollywood actress at the centre of their contention. She has been given to marry the professional arrogant player but her heart belongs with the underdog and she is torn on what to do as the wedding date draws

closer. Through this novel, Algenes, weaves a tale of romance, heroism and exposes the dark side of the game of cricket. Cricket has become the richest game and India has taken over as the custodian of this game from England. Algenes' love for cricket comes through every page as he takes you through wicket losses and wins. The hero, Landon, finds love again after a tragic loss and walks off into

the sunset with his love. The underdog cricketer marries the rich Bollywood actress. All is well that ends well. Cricket Maiden is a heart warming read.

During the later 15th and in the 16th centuries pictures

began to be made without action, without place for heroism, pictures more

rueful than celebratory. In part, Renaissance art adjusted to the social and economic pressures with an art we may be hard pressed to recognize under that same rubric—an art not so much of perfected nature as simply artless. Granted, the heroic and epic mode of the Renaissance was that practiced most self-consciously and proudly. Yet it is one of the accomplishments

of Renaissance art that heroic and epic subjects and style occasionally made way for less affirmative subjects and compositional norms, for improvisation away from the Vitruvian ideal. The limits of idealizing art, during the very period denominated as High Renaissance, is a topic that involves us in the history of class prejudice, of gender stereotypes, of the

conceptualization of the present, of attitudes toward the ordinary, and of scruples about the power of sight. Exploring the low style leads us particularly to works of art intended for display in private settings as personally owned objects, potentially as signs of quite personal emotions rather than as subscriptions to publicly vaunted ideologies. Not all of them show shepherds or

peasants; none of them—not even Giorgione's *La tempesta*—is a classic pastoral idyll. The *rosso stile* is to be understood as more comprehensive than that. The issue is not only who is represented, but whether the work can or cannot be fit into the mold of a basically affirmative art.
