How do you convince men to charge across heavily mined beaches into deadly machine-gun fire? Do you appeal to their bonds with their fellow soldiers, their patriotism, their desire to end tyranny and mass murder? Certainly—but if you're the US Army in 1944, you also try another tack: you dangle the lure of beautiful French women, waiting just on the other side of the wire, ready to reward their liberators in oh so many ways. That's not the picture of the Greatest Generation that we've been given, but it's the one Mary Louise Roberts paints to devastating effect in *What Soldiers Do*. Drawing on an incredible range of sources, including news reports, propaganda and training materials, official planning documents, wartime diaries, and memoirs, Roberts tells the fascinating and troubling story of how the US military command systematically spread—and then exploited—the myth of French women as sexually experienced and available. The resulting chaos—ranging from flagrant public sex with prostitutes to outright rape and rampant venereal disease—horrified the war-weary and demoralized French population. The sexual predation, and the blithe response of the American military leadership, also caused serious friction between the two nations just as they were attempting to settle questions of long-term control over the liberated territories and the restoration of French sovereignty. While never denying the achievement of D-Day, or the bravery of the soldiers who took part, *What Soldiers Do* reminds us that history is always more useful—and more interesting—when it is most honest, and when it goes beyond the burnished beauty of nostalgia to grapple with the real lives and real mistakes of the people who lived it.

Depuis les années 50, les villes portuaires ont connu un mouvement de réaménagement de leurs fronts d'eau et qui s'est propagé à partir des villes nord-américaines sous l'intitulé de 'waterfronts revitalizations'. Le clivage ville/port est considéré comme un effet pervers qui dégrade la ville portuaire. Dans cette recherche, l'objectif est de mettre la lumière sur la problématique du clivage ville/port dans le cas d'Alger. Antonyme de nature dans les temps modernes, l'activité portuaire et l'activité urbaine ne cohabitent plus en juxtaposition sur le même territoire, le port est considéré comme une source de nuisances, de risques majeurs et de pollution qui nuit à la qualité de vie de la ville. En contrepartie, la ville par son partage des infrastructures routières et sa juxtaposition spatiale, est considérée comme étouffante pour le port et nuit à ses performances économiques. À vrai dire, Alger actuellement est le terrain de bataille entre la ville et

le port, la préférence de l'un se faisant toujours au détriment de l'autre. Mais d'un autre côté, il faut admettre que le port d'Alger est caduc face aux nouvelles exigences du gigantisme naval car il est resté inchangé depuis plus de 50 ans et son remplacement est devenu plus que nécessaire au vu des pertes économiques qu'il cause au pays. Face à cette délocalisation envisagée du port d'Alger, et ce clivage que vivent ville et port, la recomposition ville/port sera-t-elle le destin d'Alger à l'image des autres villes portuaires qui lui ont précédé ? Aujourd'hui et plus que jamais "l'Alger rêve", face aux ambitions de cette 'métropole inachevée' (SAFAR-ZITOUN M. 2001) et les problèmes qu'elle vit, la recomposition ville-port demeure comme l'opportunité ultime pour 'sa montée en gamme', pour réaliser ses rêves et dépasser ses problèmes, comme en témoignent plusieurs exemples aînés de réaménagement 'waterfront' à l'instar de Lisbonne, Marseille, Dunkerque, Hambourg, etc.

Workers who loaded and unloaded ships have formed a distinctive occupational group over the past two centuries. As trade expanded so the numbers of dock labourers increased and became concentrated in the major ports of the world. This ambitious two-volume project goes beyond existing individual studies of dock workers to develop a genuinely comparative international perspective over a long historical period. Volume 1 contains studies of 22 major ports worldwide. Built around an agreed framework of issues, these 'port studies' examine the type of workers who dominated dock labour, their race, class and ethnicity, the working conditions of dockers and the role of government as employer, arbitrator and supporter. The studies also detail how dockers organized their labour, patterns of strike action and involvement in political organizations. The structure of the port city is also outlined and descriptions given of the waterside environment. These areas of investigation form the basis for a series of 11 thematic studies which comprise Volume 2. Drawing on the information provided in the port studies, these essays identify important aspects and recurring themes, and explain how and why particular cases diverge from the rest. The final chapter of the book synthesizes the various approaches taken to offer a model which suggests several configurations of dock labour and presents suggestions for future research. This major scholarly achievement represents the most sustained attempt to date to provide a comparative international history of dock labour. An annotated bibliography completes this essential reference work.

Our societies have become very crisis-prone. This book explores crises and the methods of anticipation, management and reconstruction, and considers a risk-crisis-territorial development continuum. The aim is to better understand a widely used concept and clarify the methods of action in the field of crisis management. The different forms of learning proposed to better face future crises are also questioned. This book invites us to analyze the resources available to support crisis management and reconstruction, and consider the unequal access to these resources in different territories in order to design future territorial strategies. This often results in a form of territorial inertia after the crises. However, some innovate, imagine renewed territories, prepare for reconstruction, or even recompose territories now in order to make them more resilient. The crisis can then be the driving force or the accelerator of these changes and contribute to the emergence of new practices, or even new urban and territorial utopias.

This wide-ranging theme takes Braudel's concept of the "Mediterranean" as its starting point.

Braudel's vision of an enclosed sea as a geographical opportunity for economic integration between nations with different religions, languages and ethnicities and political bodies still functions as a model for studies on a wide range of contexts. The goal of the 50th Study Week was to go beyond the study of individual systems in isolation, and to combine instead different analysis of open and enclosed seas or coastal areas in order to understand the integration role played by maritime connections in Europe. Since in pre-industrial civilizations water transport was easier than land transport, the time has come to bring attention to the way these relationship networks operated both on a European level and with Asian and North African trade partners. This volume starts from the great research traditions which have, however, rarely been integrated on a larger and continental scale, and analyses them on either a regional or thematic basis. Immanuel Wallerstein has developed Braudel's concept by conceptualising its intercultural and transnational dimensions and its role in the system of labour. He called it a "world system", not because it involves the whole world, but because it is larger than any legally defined political unit. And it is a "world economy" because the base link between the different parts of the system has an economic nature. The various regional research aspects and traditions have been linked together in a coherent approach which aims at evaluating: - What geographical, nautical, technical, economic, legal, social and cultural elements influenced the emergence of the various regional networks, and how these worked; - The nature and role of seaports as nodal points of sea routes and of their hinterland through rivers, canals and roads; - The commercial and personal ties between merchants and shipowners in various ports; - How regional networks connected with each other and how, over time, they ended up integrating into larger units; - How private networks, initially between merchant and seafarer organizations, ended up dealing with local authorities and, after their growth, with states and empires in order to protect their interests.
