In Centennial Fever Javier Moreno-Luzón, one of the most prominent Spanish historians of his generation, studies the milestones that defined transnational dimensions of celebration at the beginning of the 20th century including the Peninsular War, the first Spanish Constitution, the independence of Latin American States, the “discovery” of the Pacific Ocean and the death of Miguel de Cervantes and the publication of Don Quixote of La Mancha. Through these truly global events, a cultural community is created, called “Hispanoamerica” or “La Raza”, on which Spanish nationalism has become dependent.

Since the publication of the still very valuable Biblioteca histórica de la filología by Cipriano Muñoz y Manzano, conde de la Viñaza (Madrid, 1893), our knowledge of the history of the study of the Spanish language has grown considerably, and most manuscript and secondary sources had never been tapped before Hans-Josef Niederehe of the University of Trier courageously undertook the task to bring together any available bibliographical information together with much more recent research findings, scattered in

libraries, journals and other places. The resulting *Bibliografía cronológica de la lingüística, la gramática y la lexicografía del español: Desde los principios hasta el año 1600* (BICRES) began appearing in 1994. BICRES I covered the period from the early beginnings to 1600), followed by BICRES II (1601–1700), BICRES III (1701–1800), and together with Miguel Ángel Esparza Torres of Madrid there followed BICRES IV (1801 to 1860). Now, the fifth volume, has become available, covering the years from 1861 to 1899. Access to the bibliographical information of altogether 5,272 titles is facilitated by several detailed indexes, such as a short title index, a listing of printers, publishers and places of production, and an author index. More than twenty years of research in the major libraries of Spain and other European countries have gone into this unique work — relative sources of the Americas have also been covered — making it exhaustive source for any serious scholar of any possible aspect of the Spanish language.

La Guerra Chichimeca fue un conflicto que a lo largo del siglo XVI puso a prueba la capacidad del Imperio Español para expandir sus fronteras en las latitudes del Nuevo Mundo. Librada en el territorio de la Nueva Galicia, unidad geopolítica emplazada al noroeste de la Nueva España, tuvo por resultado la conformación de la primera frontera continental del espacio americano, una frontera que demandó la afluencia de hombres (hispanos, indígenas y mano de obra negra) y recursos para su sostenimiento. En la gestación y perpetuación de este escenario de conflicto se confabularon las características geográficas (espacio semidesértico de grandes dimensiones y de difícil comunicación), culturales (sociedades nativas en su mayor parte recolectoras-cazadoras) y económicas (descubrimiento de ricas vetas argentíferas a partir de mediados de la centuria) de aquel espacio. La presente investigación es una oportunidad para reevaluar los condicionantes que moldearon la conformación y dinámica de un territorio de encuentro interétnico, poniendo sobre la mesa de discusión el rol jugado por sus principales protagonistas: militares y encomenderos, mineros estancieros, indígenas y sacerdotes franciscanos. La pugna que protagonizaron los indígenas con el invasor blanco tuvo su contraparte en la lucha teológica, jurídica y moral librada por los

hijos de San Francisco de Asís con el propósito de imponer un proyecto de pacificación no violento, aspiración que se materializó tras un arduo proceso hacia el ocaso del Siglo de Oro español, y que habría de constituirse en un referente para el accionar de otras órdenes religiosas en los apartados rincones del continente americano.

rica y larga historia, desde sus raíces prehistoricas hasta su estado actual como la lengua materna de casi 400 millones de habitantes en 21 países. El como se origino, como evoluciono, y como se habla hoy en dia alrededor del mundo contribuye a una historia fascinante que complementa el estudio del espanol escrito y hablado. El presente texto, en lengua espanola, trata la historia del espanol desde sus raíces prerromanas y latinas hasta su forma estandarizada y sus multiples variantes regionales. A lo largo de la narrativa se cubre la expansion del latin en la Peninsula Iberica, el desarrollo de los dialectos romances debido a una serie de influencias de tipo sociolinguistico, y el proceso de crear una variante estandar del espanol. Between 1778 and 1784 the Spanish Crown transported more than 1,900 peasants, including 875 women and girls, from northern Spain to South America in an ill-fated scheme to colonize Patagonia. The story begins as the colonists trudge across northern Spain to volunteer for the project and follows

them across the Atlantic to Montevideo. However, before the last ships reached the Americas, harsh weather, disease, and the prospect of mutiny on the Patagonian coast forced the Crown to abandon the project. Eventually, the peasant colonists were resettled in towns outside of Buenos Aires and Montevideo, where they raised families, bought slaves, and gradually integrated into colonial society. *Gendered Crossings* brings to life the diverse settings of the Iberian Atlantic and the transformations in the peasants' gendered experiences as they moved around the Spanish Empire.

Spanish poet, playwright, and novelist Félix Lope de Vega (1562–1635) was a key figure of Golden Age Spanish literature, second only in stature to Cervantes, and is considered the founder of Spain's classical theater. In this rich and informative study, Javier Lorenzo investigates the symbolic use of space in Lope's drama and its function as an ideological tool to promote an imagined Spanish national past.
