Marxism in a Lost Century retells the history of the radical left during the twentieth century through the words and deeds of

Paul Mattick. An adolescent during the German revolutions that followed World War I, he was also a recent émigré to the United States during the 1930s Great Depression, when the unemployed groups in which he participated were among the most dynamic manifestations of social unrest. Three biographical themes receive special attention -- the self-taught nature of left-wing activity, Mattick's experiences with publishing, and the nexus of men, politics, and friendship. Mattick found a wide audience during the 1960s because of his emphasis on the economy's dysfunctional aspects and his advocacy of workplace councils—a popularity mirrored in the cyclical nature of the global economy.

Jonas Finkel is growing up in communist Czechoslovakia, son of a middle class formerly Jewish family leading a regular life bothering no-one. Suddenly his father is arrested and disappears. His mother is left to fend for herself in an increasing array of bureaucratic entanglements forbidding her to even eke out a living protests as best she can. The official reason is their bourgeois background. The real reason is anti-semitic resentment.

A complete survey of traditional banjo styles complete with tunings, playing tips, and the author's deft drawings. Progresses from easy tunes for the beginner to more difficult pieces. The styles include up-picking or Pete Seeger's basic strum; two-finger picking; three-finger picking; and what had variously been called frailing, clawhammer, knocking, rapping, overhand, fram-style, flayin' hand, and other Appalachian names, here called down-picking.
