The description and analysis of the Mexican and other countries desertic plants from the point of view of their use in traditional medicine and their potential use in integrative medicine is the overall theme of this book. *Aromatic and Medicinal Plants of Drylands and Deserts: Ecology, Ethnobiology and Potential Uses* describes the historic use of drylands plants, botanical and geological classification, also describes the endemic plants used in traditional medicine, going through the most relevant aspects of biomedicine and integrative medicine. The chemical and bioactive compounds from desertic medicinal and aromatic plants and the analytic techniques to determine chemical and bioactive compounds from the medicinal and aromatic plants are reviewed. Ethnobiology is detailed in the present book as well as the importance of the integrative medicine for the ancient and actual cultures. Mitos, ritos, constelaciones, poesía: Roberto Calasso viaja por las formas de comunicación entre lo humano y «lo invisible» y traza un recorrido por el origen y el devenir de la cultura europea. Calasso indagaba en la trama de los ritos sacrificiales que practicaron todas las culturas y religiones (y cuya –aparente– desaparición en la era moderna no deja de tener resonancias trágicas, como también demostró en *La actualidad innombrable*), este libro vuelve sobre la compleja y fascinante configuración de aquella (enorme) parte de nuestro mundo que el racionalismo y el cientificismo dejan de lado. ¿Por qué Zeus permite que su hermano Hades rapté a su hija Perséfone, para desesperación de su madre, Deméter? ¿Cuál fue, por cierto, «la última noche de Zeus en la Tierra»? ¿Qué fue lo que más sorprendió a Heródoto de los magos egipcios durante su viaje por el Nilo? ¿Por qué el poeta Ovidio, que compiló esa enciclopedia monumental de la mitología clásica que son *Las metamorfosis*, se preocupó de escribir sobre algo tan aparentemente fútil como la cosmética o el arte de la seducción? ¿En qué se apoya la teoría de que, antes que a los grandes felinos predadores, Homo imitó a las hienas? El lector recorrerá estas páginas como en un trance: un recorrido por las formas de comunicación entre lo humano y «lo invisible»; unas formas que viven en un presente continuo. Porque esta narración es la novela de cosas que parecen muy lejanas y que, sin embargo, están entre nosotros, a poco que permitamos a Calasso indicarnos hacia dónde mirar.

An important reassessment of the later career and life of a beloved baroque

artist Hailed as one of the most influential and expressive painters of the seventeenth century, Artemisia Gentileschi (1593–ca. 1656) has figured prominently in the art historical discourse of the past two decades. This attention to Artemisia, after many years of scholarly neglect, is partially due to interest in the dramatic details of her early life, including the widely publicized rape trial of her painting tutor, Agostino Tassi, and her admission to Florence's esteemed Accademia del Disegno. LGBTQ Politics in Nicaragua Univ of California Press

Gabriel Alomar i Villalonga (Palma 1873 – El Caire 1941) va reunir la major part de la seva obra poètica en el volum *La columna de foc* (1911). Malgrat que des de la joventut havia publicat poemes en nombroses periòdics i revistes de Catalunya i de Mallorca, la poesia tan sols fou un caire més de la seva dedicació a la literatura, al costat de l'assaig i la prosa literària. Més que un poeta, Alomar va ser un intel·lectual que projectava el seu pensament en àmbits molt diversos, com la política, el periodisme i l'ensenyament. En la conferència *El futurisme* (1904) sintetitzà aquest pensament, en el qual s'integren idees molt característiques de la fi de segle XIX, tant des de l'àmbit social i polític com des del terreny purament estètic. També el modernisme es palesa en la major part dels poemes de *La columna de foc*, tot i que en alguns aspectes –com el classicisme, l'arbitrarisme i el civilisme– coincideixi amb el noucentisme. Això no obstant, l'obra poètica de l'escriptor mallorquí es va ressentir del nou context noucentista, així com de la seva dedicació a la política, per la qual cosa després de 1911 conreà la poesia de manera molt ocasional. Aquesta edició crítica de *La columna de foc* reflecteix l'origen del llibre i es complementa amb els poemes dispersos del nostre poeta que hem

pogut localitzar.
